

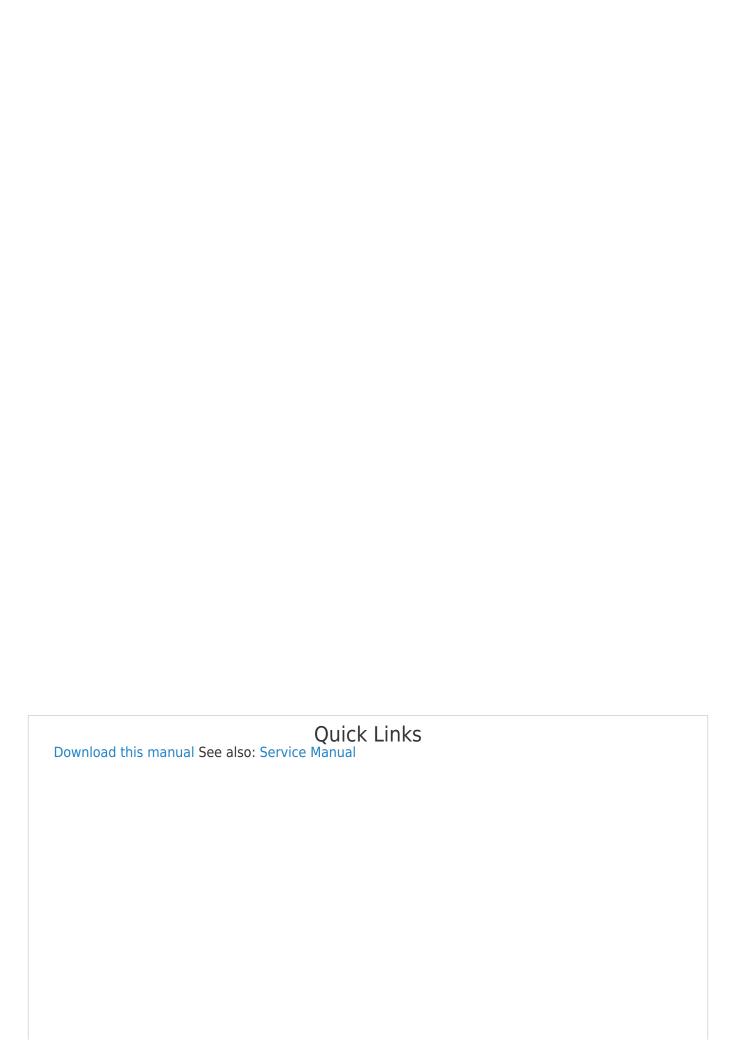

DVD video uses modern MPEG2 data compression technology that enables an entire feature film to be stored on a single five inch disc.

This means that the exact recording time will depend on the material being recorded. • When recording a TV broadcast, if the reception is poor or the picture contains interference, the recording times may be shorter.
