FCC RF EXPOSURE INFORMATION

WARNING! Read this information before using your phone

In August 1996 the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the United States with its action in Report and Order FCC 96-326 adopted an updated safety standard for human exposure to radio frequency electromagnetic energy emitted by FCC regulated transmitters. Those guidelines are consistent with the safety standard previously set by both U.S. and international standards bodies. The design of this phone complies with the FCC guidelines and these international standards.

Use only the supplied or an approved antenna. Unauthorized antennas, modifications, or attachments could impair call quality, damage the phone, or result in violation of FCC requirions

Donor use the phone with a damaged antenna. If a damaged antenna comes into contact with the skin, a minor burn may result. Please contact your local dealer for replacement antenna.

Body-worn Operation

This device was tested for typical body-worn operations with the back of the phone kept 1.5 cm. from the body. To maintain compliance with FCC RF exposure requirements, use only belt-clips, holsters or similar accessories that maintain a 1.5 cm. separation distance between the user's body and the back of the phone, including the antenna, whether extended or retracted. The use of belt-clips, holsters and similar accessories should not contain metallic components in its assembly. The use of accessories that do not satisfy these requirements may not comply with FCC RF exposure requirements, and should be avoided.

<u>Page 6</u> Power saving during standby In order to minimize the power consumption, the A1303SA display turns automatically to power saving mode when key operation is stopped for a while. The indication restores with key operation. \blacksquare Using the flexible keys Each key is allocated to an item shown in the bottom of the display.

Page 8: Getting Ready To Make A Call

1. Insert the connector of the Sanyo AC adapter 02 firmly into the desktop charging holder. 2. Connect the plug of the Sanyo AC adapter 02 into an AC wall outlet. 3. Put the telephone (A1303SA) with battery pack attached into the desktop charging holder, paying attention to the installing direction.

Page 9: Extending The Antenna

Extending the antenna The radio waves cannot be transmitted or received well if the antenna is not extended. To facilitate transmission and reception of radio waves, use the phone by positioning the antenna vertically with respect to the ground. Extending the antenna Retracting the antenna \bullet ...

Page 10 Checking the display screen Check the display screen and make sure it is shown in the figure below after you turn the power on. This will indicate if the phone is in good working order. The availability of power is indicated in three levels. 10:10

Page 11: Switch To English

Set up for first use 1. Just after you have bought the handset or you have initialized all functions and memories by performing M453 operation, press 2. Select " [][]]] " and press 3. Press 4. Select "YES" and press []]...

Page 12: Making An International Call

Page 13: Answering A Call
