Speaker: Lets you hear the different ringers and sounds. You can mute the ringer when receiving incoming calls by pressing, or the Side Up/Down Key.

Place the battery cover into the position as indicated in the diagram, then slide it until you hear it snap into the place.

Page 14: Tty Use

TTY Use A TTY (also known as a TDD or Text Telephone), is a telecommunications device that allows people who are deaf or hard of hearing, or who have speech or language disabilities, to communicate by telephone. Your phone is compatible with select TTY devices. Please check with the manufacturer of your TTY device for connectivity information and to ensure that the TTY device supports digital wireless transmission.

Page 15: Sending A Text Message

Sending a Text Message Press to access the main menu. Select Messaging and press Select Send Text and press Select Phone Book Entry and press Select a recipient using your navigation key and press (This will check the box next to the recipient's name.) -...

Page 16: Three-Way Calling

Three-Way Calling Talking with two different people at the same time is made easy with Three-Way Calling. To place a three-way call: Enter a number you wish to call and press Once you have established the connection, press (This puts the first call on hold.) Dial the second number you wish to call and press When you're connected to the second party, press once more to begin your three-way call.

Your phone informs you of the current signal strength by displaying a number of bars next to the signal strength icon.
