Long press for redialing last number that you dialed with ready link, and short press for displaying company list in the Standby mode.

Viewing the Display Screen This list identifies some of the more common symbols you'll see on your display screen. shows your current signal strength. The more lines you have, the stronger your signal. means your phone cannot find a signal. tells you a call is in progress.

Keeping track of your battery's charge is important. If your battery level becomes too low, your phone automatically turns off and you will lose all the information you were just working on.
