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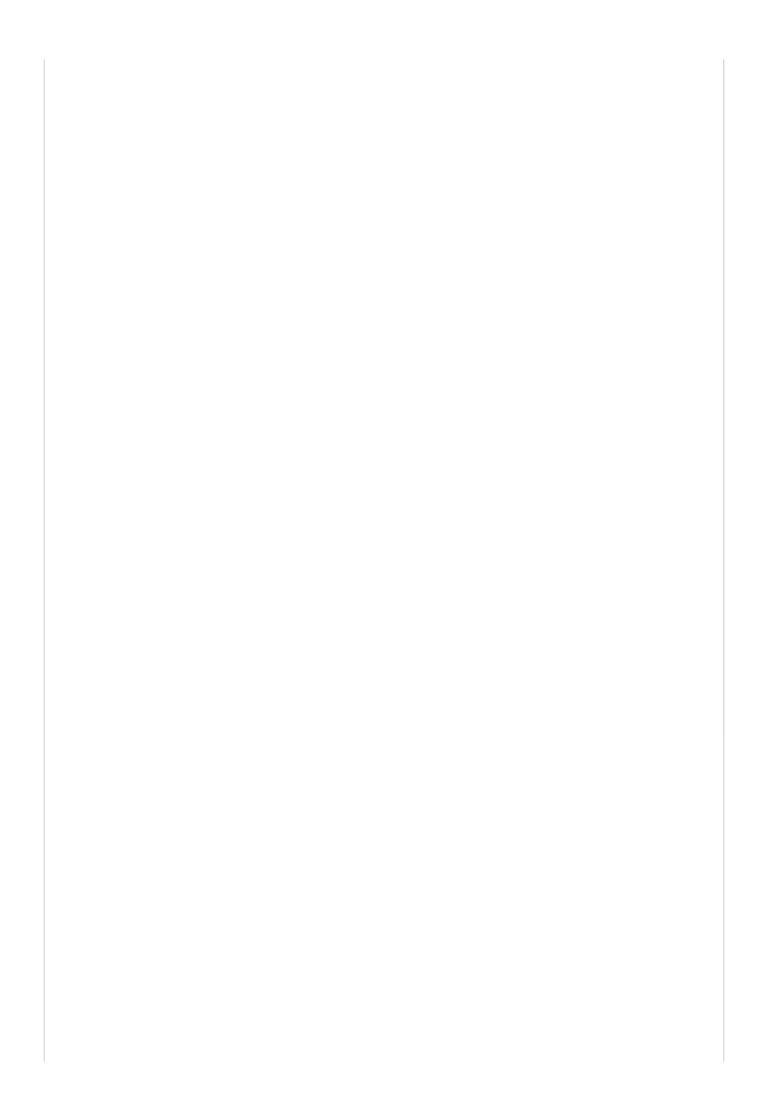
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
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1 Phone Layout and Functions

may download a few moments later when the message will be ready to view in your MMS Inbox.

This is a two-stage process: in the first stage you must set up the data connection, and in the second stage you must define the address of the MMS server on the Internet.

Text Input XT9 mode The allows you to enter words with only one keystroke per letter. Every key has more than one letter assigned to it. For example, pressing the 3 key can enter the letters D, E or F. XT9 mode compares your preceding keystrokes with an internal dictionary to formulate the most likely word.
