# Page 19: Power Button

The battery switch supplies/cuts off the battery power to the Toshiba Pocket PC. The setting of this switch at shipment is "stop". When using the Toshiba Pocket PC for the first time, slide this switch to the left (the "supply" side) with the stylus.

#### Page 20: How To Use The Stylus

On the pop-up menu that appears, tap the action you want to perform. When you operate the touch screen of the Toshiba Pocket PC, use the supplied stylus. If the tip of the stylus is damaged, do not use it. If you operate the touch screen with a damaged stylus or a ballpoint pen, the touch screen may be damaged.

#### Page 21: Battery Charging

Battery Charging A built-in battery is installed in the Toshiba Pocket PC. When using the Toshiba Pocket PC for the first time, set the battery switch to the supply side, and then charge the built-in battery with the supplied AC adapter.

# Page 22: How To Prolong Battery Life

■ Do not leave the Toshiba Pocket PC in a place of high or low temperature. It may shorten battery life. If you have not used the Toshiba Pocket PC for several days, its battery charge level reading may be inaccurate.

#### Page 23: Initial Setup

The built-in battery gradually discharges even if the device is not being used. When the Toshiba Pocket PC is left for a long time, the built-in battery of the Toshiba Pocket PC may completely discharge. As a precaution, it is recommended that you save the Toshiba Pocket PC's memory data to your computer or to a storage card.

#### Page 24: Method Of Setting Card Into Sd Card Slot

When the Complete screen appears, the initial setup is completed. ■ After tapping the screen, you can use the Toshiba Pocket PC. When you tap the Complete screen, the Today screen appears. For more information , see "Today screen" in this chapter.

#### Page 25: Connecting To A Computer

The connectable pin size of the headphone/earphone is Ø3.5 mm mini plug type. Connecting to a Computer Before connecting your Toshiba Pocket PC to a computer, check the following. ■ ActiveSync has been installed on your computer. (See Chapter 3.) ■...

# Page 26: To Connect Using The Supplied Cradle

#### Page 27: To Connect Directly Using A Connection Cable

Basic Skills To connect directly using a connection cable: Connect the Pocket PC directly to your computer using an optional USB Client cable. When the Pocket PC is connected to another device via a USB Client cable do not plug the AC adapter directly into the Pocket PC as this may lead to interference.

#### Page 28: Today Screen

Today Screen When you turn on your device for the first time each day (or after 4 hours of inactivity), you'll see the Today screen. You can also display it by tapping and then Today. On the Today screen, you can see at a glance important information for the day.

# Page 30: Programs

Drag the stylus off the label so that the command is not carried out. The following table contains a partial list of programs that are on your device. Look on the Toshiba Pocket PC Companion CD for additional programs that you can install onto your device. Icon...

#### Page 31: Navigation Bar And Command Bar

Navigation Bar and Command Bar The navigation bar is located at the top of the screen. It displays the active program and current time, and allows you to switch to programs and close screens. Use the command bar at the bottom of the screen to perform tasks in programs.

#### Page 32: Pop-Up Menus

Pop-up Menus With pop-up menus, you can quickly choose an action . For example, you can use the pop-up menu in the contact list to quickly delete a contact, make a copy of a contact, or send an e-mail message to a contact. The actions in the pop-up menus vary from program to program.

#### Page 33: Enter Information On Your Toshiba Pocket Pc

Enter Information on Your Toshiba Pocket PC You have several options for entering new information: ■ Use the input panel to enter typed text, either by using the soft keyboard or other input method ■ Write directly on the screen ■...

#### Page 34: To Type With The Soft Keyboard

When you use the input panel, your device anticipates the word you are typing or writing and displays it above the input panel. When you tap the displayed word, it is inserted into your text at the insertion point. The more you use your device, the more words it learns to anticipate.

#### Page 35: To Use Block Recognizer

To use Block Recognizer: With Block Recognizer you can input character strokes using the stylus that are similar to those used on other devices. Tap the arrow next to the Input Panel button and then Block Recognizer. Write a letter in the box. When you write a letter, it is converted to typed text that appears on the screen.

# Page 36: Writing On The Screen

Writing on the Screen In any program that accepts writing, such as the Notes program, and in the Notes tab in Calendar, Contacts, and Tasks, you can use your stylus to write directly on the screen. Write the way you do on paper. You can edit and format what you've written and convert the information to text at a later time.

# Page 37: To Convert Writing To Text

To convert writing to text: Tap Tools and then Recognize. If you want to convert only certain words, select them before tapping Recognize on the Tools menu (or tap and hold the selected words and then tap Recognize on the pop-up menu). If a word is not recognized, it is left as writing.

<u>Page 38</u> If the conversion is incorrect, you can select different words from a list of alternates or return to the original writing. To do so, tap and hold the incorrect word (tap one word at a time). On the pop-up menu, tap Alternates.

# Page 39: Drawing On The Screen

Drawing on the Screen You can draw on the screen in the same way that you write on the screen. The difference between writing and drawing on the screen is how you select items and how they can be edited. For example, selected drawings can be resized, while writing cannot.

# Page 40: Recording A Message

Recording a Message In any program where you can write or draw on the screen, you can also quickly capture thoughts, reminders, and phone numbers by recording a message. In Calendar, Tasks, and Contacts, you can include a recording in the Notes tab. In the Notes program, you can either create a standalone recording or include a recording in a written note.

# Page 41: Using My Text

Basic Skills Using My Text When using Inbox or MSN Messenger, use My Text to quickly insert preset or frequently used messages into the text entry area. To insert a message, tap My Text and tap a message. You can add text after inserting a My Text message before sending it. To edit a My Text message, in the Tools menu, tap Edit and then tap My Text Messages .

#### Page 42: Find And Organize Information

Find and Organize Information The Find feature on your device helps you quickly locate information. ■ On the data type, and then tap Go to start the search. To quickly find information that is taking up storage space on your Pocket PC, select Larger than 64 KB in Type.

#### Page 43: Customize Your Toshiba Pocket Pc

\*.xip, \*.exe,, or \*.zip file, a Setup.exe file, or several versions of files for different device types and processors. Be sure to select the program designed for the Toshiba Pocket PC and your device processor type. User's Manual...

#### Page 44: To Add A Program To The Start Menu

Read any installation instructions, Read Me files, or documentation that comes with the program. Many programs provide special installation instructions. Connect your device and desktop computer. Double-click the \*.exe file. If the file is an installer, the installation wizard will begin. Follow the directions on the screen.

#### Page 45: Setting A Password

Setting a Password You can protect data or settings from a third person by setting a password which is requested when turning power on. and then Settings. On the Personal tab, tap Password. Select the type of password you would like to use. Enter a password and tap OK.

#### Page 46: Setting Memory

Setting Memory You can adjust the data storing memory and the program running memory. You can also confirm the free space of a storage card and so on. Memory for the Pocket PC is managed automatically. To change Memory allocation: and then Settings.

#### Page 47: Chapter 3 Microsoft Activesync

Before you begin synchronization, install ActiveSync on your PC from the Toshiba Pocket PC Companion CD. For more information on installing ActiveSync, see your Quick Start card. ActiveSync is already installed on your device.

Page 48 After your first synchronization, take a look at Calendar, Contacts, and Tasks on your device. You'll notice that information you've stored in Microsoft Outlook on your PC has been

copied to your device, and you didn't have to type a word. Disconnect your device from your PC and you're ready to go! Once you have set up ActiveSync and completed the first synchronization process, you can initiate synchronization from your device.

# Page 49: Chapter 4 Microsoft Pocket Outlook

TOSHIBA Pocket PC e310 Microsoft Pocket Outlook ® Microsoft Pocket Outlook includes Calendar, Contacts, Tasks, Inbox, and Notes. You can use these programs individually or together. For example, e-mail addresses stored in Contacts can be used to address e- mail messages in Inbox.

# Page 50: Calendar: Scheduling Appointments And Meetings

Calendar: Scheduling Appointments and Meetings Use Calendar to schedule appointments, including meetings and other events. You can check your appointments in one of several views (Agenda, Day, Week, Month, and Year) and easily switch views by using the View menu. You can customize the Calendar display, such as changing the first day of the week, by tapping Options on the Tools menu.

#### Page 51: To Create An Appointment

To create an appointment If you are in Day or Week view, tap the desired date and time for the appointment. Tap New. Using the input panel, enter a description and a location. Tap first to select the field. If needed, tap the date and time to change them. Enter other desired information

# Page 52: Using The Summary Screen

Using the Summary Screen When you tap an appointment in Calendar, a summary screen is displayed. To change the appointment, tap Edit. Creating Meeting Requests You can use Calendar to set up meetings with users of Outlook or Pocket Outlook. The meeting request will be created automatically and sent either when you synchronize Inbox or when you connect to your e-mail server.

# Page 53: Contacts: Tracking Friends And Colleagues

Contacts: Tracking Friends and Colleagues Contacts maintains a list of your friends and colleagues so that you can easily find the information you're looking for, whether you're at home or on the road. Using the device infrared (IR) port, you can quickly share Contacts information with other device users.

# Page 54: To Create A Contact

To create a contact: Tap New. Using the input panel, enter a name and other contact information. You will need to scroll down to see all available fields. To assign the contact to a category, scroll to and tap Categories and select a category from the list.

<u>Page 55</u> Using the Summary Screen When you tap a contact in the contact list, a summary screen is displayed. To change the contact information, tap Edit. User's Manual Microsoft Pocket Outlook View contact details. Tap to change contact information. Tap to view notes.

# Page 56: Tasks: Keeping A To Do List

Tasks: Keeping a To Do List Use Tasks to keep track of what you have to do. To change the way information is displayed in the list, tap Tools and then Options. User's Manual Microsoft Pocket Outlook Select the category of tasks you want displayed in the list.

#### Page 57: To Create A Task

To create a task: Tap New. Using the input panel, enter a description. You can enter a start date and due date or enter other information by first tapping the field. If the input panel is open, you will need to hide it to see all available fields.

<u>Page 58</u> Using the Summary Screen When you tap a task in the task list, a summary screen is displayed. To change the task, tap Edit. User's Manual Microsoft Pocket Outlook View task details. Tap to show and hide additional summary information. View notes.

# Page 59: Notes: Capturing Thoughts And Ideas

Notes: Capturing Thoughts and Ideas Quickly capture thoughts, reminders, ideas, drawings, and phone numbers with Notes. You can create a written note or a recording. You can also include a recording in a note. If a note is open when you create the recording, it will be included in the note as an icon.

# Page 60: Inbox: Sending And Receiving E-Mail Messages

To create a note: Tap New. Create your note by writing, drawing, typing, and recording. For more information about using the input panel, writing and drawing on the screen, and creating recordings, see Chapter 2. Inbox: Sending and Receiving E-mail Messages Use Inbox to send and receive e-mail messages by synchronizing e-mail messages with Microsoft Exchange or Microsoft Outlook on your PC.

#### Page 61: Using The Message List

Using the Message List Messages you receive are displayed in the message list. By default, the most recently received messages are displayed first in the list. When you receive a message, tap it to open it. Unread messages are displayed in bold. User's Manual Microsoft Pocket Outlook Select the service and folder you want to display.

#### Page 62: Composing Messages

When you connect to your e-mail server or synchronize with your desktop computer, by default, you'll receive messages from the last five days only, the first 100 lines of each new message, and file attachments of less than 100 KB in size. The original messages remain on the e-mail server or your desktop computer.

<u>Page 63</u> Compose your message. To enter preset or frequently used messages, tap My Text and select a message. Tap Send when you've finished the message. If you are working offline, the message is moved to the Outbox folder and will be sent the next time you connect.

<u>Page 64</u> Microsoft Pocket Outlook ■ If you use IMAP4, the folders you create and the e-mail messages you move are mirrored on the server. Therefore, messages are available to you anytime you connect to your mail server, whether it is from your device or desktop computer.

#### Page 65: Chapter 5 Companion Programs

TOSHIBA Pocket PC e310 Companion Programs The companion programs consist of Microsoft Pocket Excel, Windows Media™ Player, and Microsoft To switch to a companion program on your device, tap Programs on the menu, and then tap the program name. Pocket Word Pocket Word works with Microsoft Word on your desktop computer to give you easy access to copies of your documents.

<u>Page 66</u> Pocket Word contains a list of the files stored on your device. Tap a file in the list to open it. To delete, make copies of, and send files, tap and hold a file in the list. Then, select the appropriate action on the popup menu. You can enter information in Pocket Word in one of four modes (typing, writing, drawing, and recording), which are displayed on the View menu.

#### Page 67: Typing Mode

Typing Mode Using the input panel, enter typed text into the document. For more information on entering typed text, see Chapter 2. To format existing text and to edit text, first select the text. You can select text as you do in a Word document, using your stylus instead of the mouse to drag through the text you want to select.

#### Page 68: Writing Mode

Writing Mode In writing mode, use your stylus to write directly on the screen. Ruled lines are displayed as a guide, and the zoom magnification is greater than in typing mode to allow you to write more easily. For more information on writing and selecting writing, see Chapter 2.

#### Page 69: Drawing Mode

Drawing Mode In drawing mode, use your stylus to draw on the screen. Gridlines appear as a guide. When you lift your stylus off the screen after the first stroke, you'll see a drawing box indicating the boundaries of the drawing. Every subsequent stroke within or touching the

drawing box becomes part of the drawing.

# Page 70: Pocket Excel

Pocket Excel Pocket Excel works with Microsoft Excel on your desktop computer to give you easy access to copies of your workbooks. You can create new workbooks on your device, or you can copy workbooks from your desktop computer to your device. Synchronize workbooks between your desktop computer and your device so that you have the most up-to-date content in both locations.

#### Page 71: Msn Messenger

Tips for Working in Pocket Excel Note the following when working in large worksheets in Pocket Excel: ■ View in full-screen mode to see as much of your worksheet as possible. Tap View and then Full Screen. To exit full-screen mode, tap Restore.

#### Page 72: Working With Contacts

Setting Up Before you can connect, you must enter Passport or Exchange account information. To set up an account and sign in: In the Tools menu, tap Options . In the Accounts tab, enter your Passport or Exchange account information. To sign in, tap the sign-in screen and enter your e-mail address and password.

#### Page 73: Chatting With Contacts

Chatting with Contacts Tap a contact name to open a chat window. Enter your message in the text entry area at the bottom of the screen, or tap My Text to enter a preset message, and tap Send. To invite another contact to a multi-user chat, in the Tools menu, tap Invite and tap the contact you want to invite.

<u>Page 74</u> To know if the contact you are chatting with is responding, look for the message under the text entry area. For more information on using MSN Messenger, tap User's Manual Companion Programs View full chat. View status of the chat. and then Help.

#### Page 75: Windows Media Player

Windows Media. Use Microsoft Windows Media Player on your desktop computer to copy digital audio and video files to your Toshiba Pocket PC. You can play Windows Media and MP3 files on your Toshiba Pocket PC. For more information about using Windows Media Player for Toshiba...

#### Page 76: Microsoft Reader

Sample books and a dictionary are also included in MSReader in the Extras folder on the Toshiba Pocket PC Companion CD. Use ActiveSync to download the files from your desktop computer to your activated device as described in the Read Me file in the MSReader folder.

# Page 77: Using The Library

Using the Library The Library is your MSReader home page; it displays a list of all books stored on your device or storage card. To open the Library: ■ On the MSReader command bar, tap Library. ■ On a book page, tap the book title, and then tap Library on the popup menu.

#### Page 78: Using Reader Features

In addition to the text, each book page includes a page number and book title. You can also page through a book by using the Up/Down control on your device. Using Reader Features Reading a book electronically gives you several options not available with paper books.

# Page 79: Removing A Book

■ Drawings: When you add a drawing, a Drawing icon appears in the bottom-left corner of the page, and drawing tools appear across the bottom of the page. Draw by dragging your stylus. ■ To see a list of a book's annotations, including bookmarks, highlights, text notes, and drawings, tap Annotations Index on the book's cover page.

### Page 80: Chapter 6 Pocket Internet Explorer

# Page 81: Mobile Favorites

Mobile Favorites If you are using Microsoft Internet Explorer 5.0 or later on your desktop computer, you can download mobile favorites to your device. Synchronizing mobile favorites downloads Web content to your device so that you can view pages while you are disconnected from your ISP and desktop computer.

#### Page 82: Using Avantgo Channels

Using AvantGo Channels AvantGo is a free interactive service that gives you access to personalized content and thousands of popular Web sites. You subscribe to AvantGo channels directly from your device. Then, you synchronize your device and desktop computer, or connect to the Internet to download the content.

#### Page 83: To View Mobile Favorites And Channels

To view mobile favorites and channels: Tap the Favorites button to display your list of favorites. Tap the page you want to view. You'll see the page that was downloaded the last time you synchronized with your desktop computer. If the page is not on your device, the favorite will be dimmed.

#### Page 88: Display Icon List
