

Page 6: Starting Your Dishwasher

Starting Your Dishwasher This section tells you how to start or stop your dishwasher. a wash cycle Starting 1. Load the dishwasher. See pages 7-I 1. 2. Spin the spray arms, They should turn freely. 3. Add detergent. See page 12. 4.

Page 7: Loading Your Dishwasher

Loading Your Dishwasher This section tells how to properly load your dishwasher Preparing to load your dishwasher To save water and energy, do not rinse dishes before putting them into the dishwasher. Remove large pieces of food, bones, and other hard items. The POWER CLEANTM module removes food particles from the water.

<u>Page 8</u> Loading the silverware Load the silverware basket while it is in the door or take the basket out for loading on a counter or table. Mix items in each section of the basket with some pointing up and some down to avoid nesting.

Page 9 Loading the bottom Load items with cooked-on or dried-on food in the bottom rack, with soiled surfaces facing inward to the spray. Mixed load Load plates, soup bowls, etc., between prongs and facing inward to the spray. Make sure pot handles and other items do not stop rotation of the spray arms.

<u>Page 10</u> Loading the top rack Load the top rack with cups, glasses, and other small items. Do not cover the third level wash when loading the top rack. Cup and glass load Load so open ends face down for cleaning and draining. Load glasses in top rack only - bottom rack is not designed for glasses.

<u>Page 11</u> Adjustable 3-position top rack (on some models) You can raise or lower the rack to fit tall items in either the top or bottom rack. The high and low positions are marked on the adjuster on the side facing the center of the dishwasher.

Page 12: Using The Dispensers

Using the Dispensers For best washing results, review the information below. It is important to use detergents and rinse agents properly. Using the detergent Use automatic dishwashing detergent only. Other detergents are too mild and much too sudsy. Add detergent just before starting cycle. Store tightly closed detergent in a cool, dry place.

<u>Page 13</u> Using the rinse agent Keep the rinse agent dispenser filled with a liquid rinse agent. A rinse agent greatly improves dish drying by helping water flow off them during the last rinse. A rinse agent also keeps water from forming droplets and drying as spots or streaks.

Page 14: Setting The Controls

Setting the Controls Operating your dishwasher's controls properly helps you obtain the best possible washing results. This section tells you how to select wash cycles and options. Selecting a wash cycle Press a Cycle pad. (Some cycles share the same pad.) Turn the cycle control knob to the desired cycle.

Page 15: Canceling A Cycle

The water heats to 140°F in the final rinse (marked 7). Select the Air Dry Option when using this cycle. On 915 Model Series: Air Dry is automatically selected. - Cycle time includes dry time and may be longer depending...

Page 16: Selecting Cycle Options

Air Dry. For 900 Model Series: Always select the Air Dry option when using the Rinse-Wash Later cycle. For 915 Model Series: The Air Dry option is automatically lected for the Rinse-Wash Later cycle. setting NOTE: Turning the cycle control knob...

Page 17: Adding An Item During A Cycle

Adding an item during You can add an additional item to the dishwasher anytime before the cycle control knob reaches Light. Items added after the cycle control knob reaches Light may only be rinsed. 1. Lift up the door latch to stop the cycle. Wait for spraying action to stop before opening the door.
