



It is full of valuable information about how to operate and maintain your appliance properly and safely.

#### Page 4: Microwave Oven Safety

INSTRUCTIONS should be followed, including \*The microwave oven should be serviced only by qualified service personnel. Call an authorized Whirlpool service company for examination, repair, or adjustment. Do not cover or block any openings on the microwave oven.

### <u>Page 5: Precautions To Avoid Possible Exposure To Excessive Microwave Energy</u>

@To reduce the risk of fire in the oven cavity: - Do not overcook food. Carefully attend the microwave oven if paper, plastic, or other combustible materials are placed inside the oven to facilitate cooking. - Remove wire twist-ties from paper or plastic bags before placing bag in oven.

#### Page 6: Electrical Requirements

Electrical requirements Observe all governing codes and ordinances. A 120 Volt, 60 Hz, AC only, 15 amp fused electrical supply is required. (A time-delay fuse is recommended.) #### Page 7: Microwave Oven

Getting to Know Your Microwave This section discusses the concepts behind microwave cooking. It also shows you the basics you need to know to operate your microwave oven. Please read this information before you use your oven. Do not store flammable microwave Doing so can result in death, explosion, How your microwave...

<u>Page 8</u> The glass turntable of your microwave oven lets microwaves pass through. Then they bounce off a metal floor, back through the glass turntable, and are absorbed by the food. Microwaves pass through most glass, paper, and plastics without heating them so food absorbs the energy.

#### Page 9: Oven

For the best cooking Always cook food for the minimum recommended cooking time. If necessary, touch ADD MINUTE while the oven is operating or after it has completed the cooking cycle (see "Using ADD MINUTE" in the "Using Your Microwave" section for more information).

#### Page 10: Testing Your Dinnerware Or Cookware

Testing your dinnerware Test dinnerware or cookware before using. To test a dish for safe use, put it into the oven with a cup of water beside it. Cook at 100% cook power for one minute. if the dish gets hot and water stays cool, do not use it.

<u>Page 11</u> Use hot pads. Microwave energy does not heat containers, but heat from the food can make the container hot. Do not overcook potatoes. Fire could result. At the end of the recommended cooking time, potatoes should be slightly firm because they will continue cooking during standing time.

#### Page 12: Electrical Connection

If your turntable cracks or breaks, contact your Whirlpool dealer for a replacement. When you use a browning dish, the brown- ing dish bottom must be at least above the turntable.

#### Page 13: Microwave Oven Features

Microwave oven features Your microwave oven is designed to make your cooking experience as

enjoyable and productive as possible. To get you up and running quickly, the following is a list of the oven's basic features: 1. Door Handle. Pull to open door. 2.

#### Page 14: Control Panel Features

Control panel features Your microwave oven control panel lets you select the desired cooking function quickly and easily. All you have to do is touch the necessary Command Pad. The following is a list of all the Command and Number Pads located on the control panel. For more information, pages 18-44.

<u>Page 15</u> 3. POPCORN. Touch this pad to pop popcorn with the "SENSOR QUICK TOUCH" feature. The oven's sensor will tell the oven how long to cook depending on the amount of humidity it detects from the popcorn. See page 41 for more information.

<u>Page 16</u> 20. TURNTABLE OFF. Touch this pad to stop the turntable only during the WARM HOLD and cook time functions. Stop the turntable only if the dish you are using is too long to turn inside the oven. To stop the turntable, touch TURNTABLE OFF before touching START/ENTER.

<u>Page 17</u> Using the safety lock The safety lock prevents unwanted use of the microwave oven by disabling the control panel Command Pads. To lock or deactivate the control Touch and hold START/ENTER 4 seconds. Three tones, followed by 2 tones, will sound and fi will appear on the Display.

#### Page 18: Using The Fan

Using the fan The Fan pad on the bottom right of the control panel controls the 2-speed Fan. 1. Choose fan speed. NOTE: If the temperature gets too hot around the microwave oven, the fan in the vent hood will automatically turn on at the LOW setting to protect the oven.

<u>Page 19</u> 3. Set stop time. Example to stop the fan at 1:30, when time of day is 12 o'clock: NOTE: You can set the stop time up to the next 12 hours. 4. Start timed fan function. NOTE: The letter 'IF" indicates the timed fan feature has been selected.

#### Page 20: Using The Cooktop/Countertop Light

Using the cooktop/countertop The pad on the bottom center of the control panel controls the cooktop/countertop 1. Turn on light. Press the LIGHT pad once for HIGH, twice for LOW (night light). 2. Turn off light when desired. To set light to be on for a specific time:...

<u>Page 21</u> Set stop time. Example to turn off light at 2 o'clock, when time of day is 12 o'clock: NOTE: You can set the time up to the next 12 hours. 4. Start timed fan function. NOTE: The letter I" indicates the timed light feature has been selected.

#### Page 22: Using The Bi-Level Cooking Rack

If you need a replacement rack, you can order one from your authorized Whirlpool service company, or by calling the Consumer Assistance Center at I-808-253-1301. sure to have your model number when ordering.

#### Page 23: Setting The Clock

Setting the clock When your microwave oven is first plugged in or after a power failure, the Display will show "888:88". For the first 30 seconds after the power is on, you can set the clock time without touching CLOCK. After 30 seconds have gone by, you must follow the directions below to set the time.

#### Page 24: Using The Minute Timer

Using the Minute You can use your microwave oven as a minute timer. Use the Minute Timer for timing up to 99 minutes, 99 seconds. NOTE: The oven can operate while the Minute Timer is in use. To see the Minute Timer while the oven is cooking, touch TIMER SET.

<u>Page 25</u> At end of countdown: (one tone will sound) To cancel Minute Timer: YOU SEE During countdown: After countdown:...

#### Page 26: Using Your Microwave Oven

#### Page 27: Cooking At Different Cook Powers

Cooking at different For best results, some recipes call for differ- ent Cook Powers. The lower the Cook Power, the slower the cooking. Each Number Pad also stands for a different percentage of Cook Power. Many microwave cookbook recipes tell you by number, percent, or name which Cook Power to use.

#### Page 29: Cooking With More Than One Cook Cycle

Cooking with more than one cook For best results, some recipes call for one Cook Power for a certain length of time, and another Cook Power for another length of time. Your oven can be set to change from one to another automatically, for up to two cycles.

#### Page 30: Using Auto Defrost

#### Page 35: Defrosting Tips

Weight conversion chart You are probably used to food weights as being in pounds and ounces that are fractions of a pound (for example 4 ounces equals I/4 pound). However, in order to enter food weight in AUTO DEFROST, you specify pounds and tenths of a pound.

#### Page 36: Using Warm Hold

Using WARM HOLD You can safely keep hot, cooked food warm in your microwave oven for up to 99 minutes, 99 seconds (about 1 hour, 40 minutes). You can use WARM HOLD by itself, or to auto- matically follow a cooking cycle. NOTES: WARM HOLD operates for up to 99 minutes, 99 seconds.

#### Page 37: Using Personal Choice

Using PERSONAL PERSONAL CHOICE allows you to recall one cooking instruction previously placed in memory and begin cooking quickly. For example, if you heat a roll every morning, program the cooking steps into PERSONAL CHOICE. You can heat your roll each morning by

#### Page 38: Using "Sensor Quick Touch

To use PERSONAL CHOICE: 1. Put food in oven and close the door. 2. Choose PERSONAL CHOICE. The oven will cook according to your preprogrammed instructions. At end of cooking time: Using "SENSOR QUICK TOUCH" Using COOK lets you heat common micro- wave-prepared foods without needing to program times and Cook Powers.

#### Page 39: Reheat

When sensor detects a certain amount humidity from food, cooking time is displayed. Example: At end of cooking time: Using "SENSOR QUICK TOUCH" REHEAT lets you heat foods without needing to program times and Cook Pow- ers. REHEAT has preset Cook Powers for 3 categories: Plate, Soup/Sauce, Casserole.

#### Page 40: Baked Potato

When sensor detects a certain amount of humidity from food, heating time is displayed. Example: At end of heating time: Using "SENSOR QUICK TOUCH" POTATO Cooking with BAKED POTATO lets you bake one or several potatoes by touching one pad. NOTES: Before baking, pierce potato with fork several times.

#### Page 41: Popcorn

Using "SENSOR QUICK TOUCH" POPCORN lets you pop commercially packaged microwave popcorn by touching just one pad. Pop only one package at a time. If you are using a microwave popcorn popper, follow manufacturer's instructions. Cooking performance may vary with brand and fat content.

#### Page 42: Using "Sensor Quick Touch

When sensor detects a certain amount of humidity from popcorn, popping time is displayed. Example: At end of popping time: Using "SENSOR QUICK TOUCH" REHEAT Reheating pizza with PIZZA REHEAT lets you reheat one or several slices of pizza by touching one pad.

#### Page 43: Vegetable

Using "SENSOR QUICK TOUCH" VEGETABLE Cooking with VEGETABLE lets you heat common microwave-prepared vegetables without needing to program times and Cook Powers. VEGETABLE has preset cook powers for 3 food categories: Fresh, Frozen, and Canned. To use VEGETABLE: 1. Touch VEGETABLE once to select Fresh, twice for Frozen, or three times for Canned.

#### Page 44: Using Add Minute

Using ADD MINUTE ADD MINUTE lets you cook food for 1 minute at 100% Cook Power or add an extra minute to your cooking cycle. You can also use it to extend cooking time in multiples of 1 minute, up to 99 minutes. NOTES: To extend cooking time in multiples of 1 minute, touch ADD MINUTE repeatedly...

#### Page 45: Caring For Your Microwave Oven

Caring for Your Microwave Oven To make sure your microwave oven looks good and works well for a long time, you should maintain it properly. For proper care, please follow these instructions For interior surfaces: Wash often with warm, sudsy water and a sponge or soft cloth.

#### Page 46: Caring For The Filters

Caring for the filters Do not allow grease and soil to build up in the grease filters. It will decrease the exhaust fan efficiency. Remove and clean grease filters at least once a month. When you have removed a grease filter or a charcoal filter remember to replace the filter before you operate the hood.

<u>Page 47</u> Replace- ment charcoal filters are available from your authorized Whirlpool service company, Part No. 4959416, or by calling the Consumer Assistance Center at I-800-253-1301. cannot clean the charcoal filter and should replace it every 6-I 2 months.

#### Page 52: Microwave Cooking Tips

Microwave cooking Amount of food If you increase or decrease the amount of food you prepare, the time it takes to cook that food will also change. For example, if you double a recipe, add a little more than half the original cooking time. Check for doneness and, if necessary, add more time in small increments.

<u>Page 53</u> Arranging food For best results, distribute food evenly on the plate. You can do this in several ways: If you are cooking several items of the same food, such as baked potatoes, place them in a ring pattern for uniform cooking.

#### Page 54: Questions And Answers
