Wired Setup Connect your TV to your network by connecting the LAN port on the back of your TV to an external modem or router using a LAN (Ethernet/Cat 5) cable. See the illustration below. NOTES • You get access to the Internet through your TV. You are recommended to use a modem or router that supports Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol (DHCP). Modems and routers that support DHCP automatically provide the IP address, subnet mask, gateway, and DNS, so you don't have to enter them manually. Most home networks already have DHCP. Wireless Setup

To connect your TV to your wireless network, you need a wireless router or modem. See the illustration below.






