

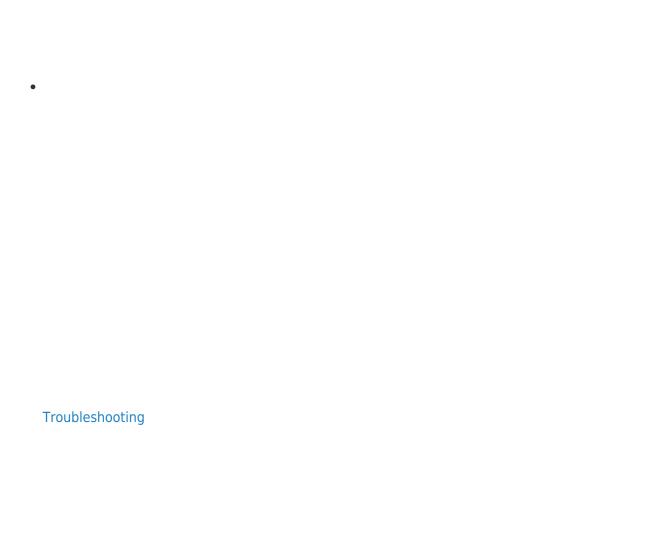

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


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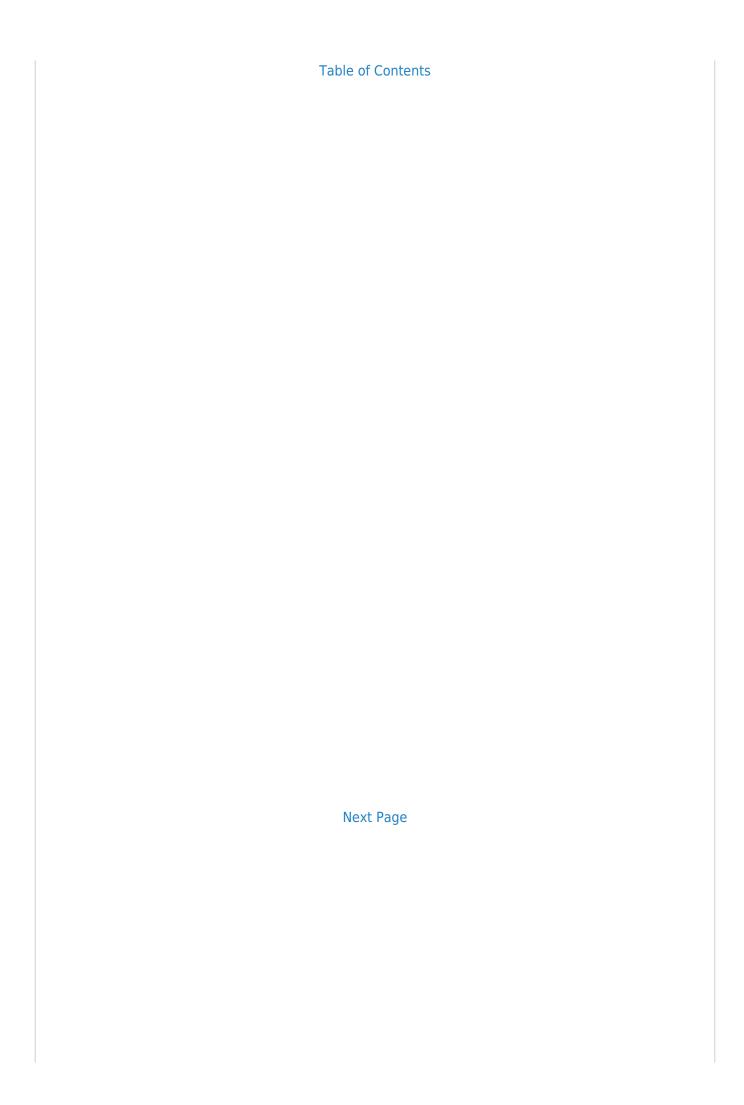

Page 6: Drain System

Page 7: Electrical Requirements

Electrical Requirements If codes permit and a separate ground wire is used, it is WARNING recommended that a qualified electrician determine that the ground path is adequate. Do not ground to a gas pipe. Check with a qualified electrician if you are not sure the washer is properly grounded.

Page 8: Installation Instructions

INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS Remove Transport System Connect the Inlet Hoses Insert new flat washers (supplied) into each end of the inlet WARNING hoses. Firmly seat the washers in the couplings. Page 9: Route The Drain Hose

To begin the wash cycle immediately Select and hold START (for approximately 3 seconds). If you do not select START within 5 minutes of choosing a cycle, the washer display automatically shuts off.

Page 14: Restarting

Door Locked Restarting To restart the washer at any time, select CANCEL/DRAIN. When the Door Locked LED light illuminates, the door is locked. The door is locked and unlocked automatically, depending on the Changing Cycles and Options stage of the wash cycle. Press and hold CANCEL/DRAIN for 3 seconds to unlock the door manually.
