<u>Page 14</u> SETTING UP YOUR OVEN TURNTABLE INSTALLATION Cleaning the cooking compartment and putting the turntable in place. For new installations, make sure all packaging and shipping tape has been removed from the turntable shaft. Before using the appliance to prepare food for the first time, you will need to put the turntable in place correctly.

Page 15 COUNTERTOP INSTALLATION Remove all packing material and accessories. Examine the oven for any damage such as dents or broken door. Do not install if oven is damaged. Cabinet: Remove any protective film found on the microwave oven cabinet surface. Do not remove the light brown Mica cover that is attached to the oven cavity to protect the magnetron.

Page 16: Instruction For Use

INSTRUCTION FOR USE BEFORE USING FOR THE FIRST TIME It is normal that the stove may produce unpleasant odors when it is used for the first time. This section tells you what you need to do before using your microwave to prepare food for the first time.

Page 19: Kitchen Timer

Press Kit.Timer/Clock to con rm. 3. KITCHEN TIMER When the microwave oven is plugged into an outlet, "0:00" will display. Press Kit.Timer/Clock once. Turn the knob to set the time, it should be within 0:05-95:00. Press to start counting down. • The Kitchen Timer setting is di erent from the Clock setting; it is simply a timer.

Page 20: Microwave Cook

4. MICROWAVE COOK When the microwave oven is plugged into an outlet , "0:00" will display. Press Power more time to choose the power level. Press Power once, and then turn the knob to set the power level Press to con rm the power level. Turn the knob to set the time, it should be within 0:05-95:00.

Page 21: Combination Function (Convection + Microwave)

Page 23: Auto Menu

Turn the knob to set the time, it should be within 0:05-95:00. Press to start cooking. 9. Auto Menu In waiting state, Turn the knob right to set the menu. A01-A06 will display in order. Press to con rm the menu. Turn the knob to set the weight of the food.

Page 25: Weight Defrost

11. WEIGHT DEFROST Press Pro Defrost repeatedly to choose the defrost menu. Press Pro Defrost once, "dEF1" will display. and then turn the knob to choose the defrost menu. "dEF1-

dEF6" are available. Press to con rm. Turn the knob to choose the defrost weight, it should be within 4-700z. Press to start counting down.

Page 26: Time Defrost

12. TIME DEFROST Press Pro Defrost repeatedly to choose the "dEF7". Press Pro Defrost once, "dEF1" will display. and then turn the knob to choose the menu" dEF7". Press to con rm. Turn the knob to choose the defrost time, it should be within 0:05-95:00.

Page 27: Speed Cooking

Page 28: Lock Function

17. ECO FUNCTION To enter ECO mode: In waiting state, press "", the screen will trun off. To cancel ECO mode: In ECO mode, turn the knob, press any keys or open oven door. 19. WIFI CONNECTION Connect the network Please turn on the Bluetooth on your phone.

Page 30: Cleaning

CLEANING With good care and cleaning, your appliance will retain its appearance and remain fully functioning for a long time to come. Do not use a glass scraper, sharp or abrasive cleaning aids or detergents.

<u>Page 31</u> APPLIANCE FRONT WITH STAINLESS STEEL Hot soapy water: Clean using a dish cloth and then dry with a soft cloth. Remove splashes and patches of limescale, grease, starch and albumin immediately. Corrosion can form under these patches or splashes. Do not use glass cleaners or metal or glass scrapers for cleaning.
