

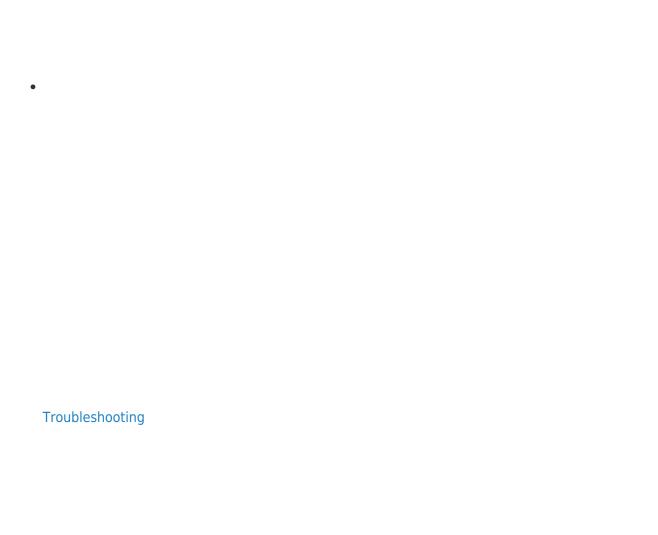

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

Page 10: Grounding Instructions

Page 14: Materials You Can Use In Microwave Oven

Page 18: Setting Up Your Oven

SETTING UP YOUR OVEN TURNTABLE INSTALLATION Cleaning the cooking compartment and putting the turntable in place. For new installations, make sure all packaging and shipping tape has been removed from the turntable shaft. Before using the appliance to prepare food for the first time, you will need to put the turntable in place correctly.

<u>Page 19</u> COUNTERTOP INSTALLATION Remove all packing material and accessories. Examine the oven for any damage such as dents or broken door. Do not install if oven is damaged. Cabinet: Remove any protective film found on the microwave oven cabinet surface. Do not remove the light brown waveguide cover that is attached to the oven cavity to protect the magnetron.

Page 20: Instruction For Use

INSTRUCTION FOR USE BEFORE USING FOR THE FIRST TIME The appliance may produce unpleasant odors when it is used for the first time. This section tells you what you need to do before using your microwave to prepare food for the first time.

Page 22: Power Levels

1. POWER LEVELS Ten power levels are available. Press "Cook Time", "00:00" will display, then press number pads. Press "Power Level" and "PL10" will display. Then press number pads to select a different power level. In cooking state of microwave, press "Power Level", the current power will be displayed for 3 seconds.

Page 23: Clock Setting

LEVEL POWER DISPLAY 2. CLOCK SETTING When the microwave oven is plugged into an outlet, "0:00" will display. Press "Clock" once, "00:00" will appear in the display. Press the number pads to enter the current clock time. For example, if the time is now 10:12, press " 1, 0, 1, 2 " in order. Press "Clock"...

Page 24: Microwave Cook

Press "START/+30Sec." to confirm setting, and the timer will start to count down. When the time amount elapses, timer indicator will disappear. The oven will beep 5 times. • The Kitchen Timer setting is different from the Clock setting; it is simply a timer.

Page 25: One Touch Start

• Press "1, 5, 0, 0" in order for 15:00 to appear in the display. • Press "Power Level" , then press "5" to select 50% microwave power. • Press " START/+30Sec. " to start cooking. The remaining cooking time will display. •...

Page 26: Custom Defrost Function

6. CUSTOM DEFROST FUNCTION Press "Custom Defrost", "dEF1" and "DEF." will appear in the display. Press the same pad repeatedly, "dEF2", "dEF3", "dEF1" will display in order. LED DISPLAY FOOD dEF1 Meat dEF2 Poultry dEF3 Fish Press number pads to enter the weight to be defrosted. Input the weight range between 0.1 to 6.0 Lbs.

Page 27: Sensor Menu

8. SENSOR MENU (Sensor Reheat, Frozen Pizza, Frozen Entrée, Potato, Rice, Veggie) Press the pad for one of the Sensor Menu functions. An "SC-" number, "Auto" and "SENS." will appear in the display. Example: If "Rice" is pressed, "SC-5" will display. Press "...

Page 28 Example: Sensor Reheat Pad • After placing food into oven, press "Sensor Reheat" pad and "SC- 1" will display. • Press " START/+30Sec. " to cook. Oven beeps 5 times when cooking is finished. • Food to be avoided in sensor reheating. a.

Page 29: Popcorn

Page 30: Soften/Melt

Press " START/+30Sec. " to cook, "Auto" flashes in display. Oven beeps 5 times when cooking is finished. 11. SOFTEN/MELT Press "Soften/Melt", "S-1" will display. Press "Soften/Melt" more times, "S-2, S-3, S-4, S-5, S-6, S-7" will display in order. After selecting SC function, press a number pad to select the weight or portion of food item.

Page 31: Favorite Function

Page 32: Multi-Stage Cooking

• Press "Favorite" to save the procedure. Oven beeps once. Or press " START/+30Sec. " directly to start cooking. • To choose the procedure from the memory list, press "Favorite" twice. Screen will display "2". Press " START/+30Sec. " to run procedure. •...

Page 33: Inquiring Function

• Press "Power Level" a gain, then press "6" to choose 60% second stage cooking power. • Press " START/+30Sec. " to to immediately start multi-stage cooking. • To choose the procedure from the memory list, press "Favorite" three times. Screen will display "3";...

Page 34: Turn On/Off The Buzzer Sound

16. TURN ON/OFF THE BUZZER SOUND It is default that the buzzer sounds is open. In waiting state, long pressing on number 8 for 3 seconds, it sounds a long beep, turns off the sound. When the sounds turn off, long pressing on 8 for 3 seconds, it sounds a long beep and the sound turns In the sound off state, all the buttons has no beep when they are...

Page 35: Cleaning

CLEANING With good care and cleaning, your appliance will retain its appearance and remain fully functioning for a long time to come. We will explain here how you should correctly care for and clean your appliance. • Scratched glass in the appliance door may develop into a crack. Do not use a glass scraper, sharp or abrasive cleaning aids or detergents.

<u>Page 36</u> APPLIANCE FRONT PLATE Hot soapy water: Clean using a dish cloth and then dry with a soft cloth. Remove splashes and patches of limescale, grease, starch and albumin immediately. Corrosion can form under these patches or splashes. Do not use glass cleaners or metal or glass scrapers for cleaning.
