Page 9: Exploring Your New Tv

Exploring your new TV You can operate your TV by using the buttons on the top panel or the remote control. The A/V terminals for connecting other equipment to your TV are on the back panel and side panel (see illustrations below). Also see "Connecting your TV"...

Page 10: Rear Terminal Cover

Rear terminal cover The connection panel is hidden behind the terminal cover. 1. Remove the cover. Release the two hooks on the bottom of the cover. 2. Install cables as necessary. 3. Reinstall the cover. Align the holes on the TV back with the three tabs on the rear terminal cover as shown.
