# Page 8: Grounding Instructions

GROUNDING INSTRUCTIONS This appliance must be grounded. In the event of an electrical short circuit, grounding reduces the risk of electric shock by providing an escape wire for the electric current. This appliance is equipped with a cord having a grounding wire with a grounding plug. The plug must be plugged into an outlet that is properly installed and grounded.

# Page 10: Materials You Can Use In Microwave Oven

<u>Page 14</u> SETTING UP YOUR OVEN TURNTABLE INSTALLATION Cleaning the cooking compartment and putting the turntable in place. For new installations, make sure all packaging and shipping tape has been removed from the turntable shaft. Before using the appliance to prepare food for the first time, you will need to put the turntable in place correctly.

Page 15 COUNTERTOP INSTALLATION Remove all packing material and accessories. Examine the oven for any damage such as dents or broken door. Do not install if oven is damaged. Cabinet: Remove any protective film found on the microwave oven cabinet surface. Do not remove the light brown Mica cover that is attached to the oven cavity to protect the magnetron.

# Page 16: Instruction For Use

INSTRUCTION FOR USE BEFORE USING FOR THE FIRST TIME It is normal that the stove may produce unpleasant odors when it is used for the first time. This section tells you what you need to do before using your microwave to prepare food for the first time.

## Page 18: Power Levels

1. POWER LEVELS Ten power levels are available. LEVEL POWER DISPLAY 100% P100 2. CLOCK SETTING When the microwave oven is plugged into an outlet, "0:00" will display. Press Clock once. Press number keys to set the hour figures, it should be within 1:00~12:59.

## Page 19: Kitchen Timer

3. KITCHEN TIMER When the microwave oven is plugged into an outlet, "0:00" will display. Timer Press Timer once. Press number keys to set the time, it should be within 00:01~99:99. Press to start counting down. • The Kitchen Timer setting is different from the Clock setting; it is simply a timer.

# Page 20: Defrost

Press number keys to set the power level. Press to start cooking. • Press to increase the cook time by 30 seconds during cooking. NOTE 5. DEFROST Press Auto Defrost repeatedly to choose the defrost menu, "dEF1", "dEF2", "dEF3" are available. Press number keys to set the defrost weight. it should be within 2~96 Oz.

## Page 21: Multi-Stage Cooking

6. MULTI-SATGE COOKING Press Auto Defrost twice, "dEF2" will display. Press number keys to set the defrost weight, it should be within 2~96 Oz. Press Power Level once , "PL10" will display. Press number keys to set the power level. Press to start cooking. •...

## Page 22: Memory Function

7. MEMORY FUNCTION Press Memory to program and choose up to three cooking procedures. Each procedure will be indicated by 1, 2 or 3 in the display. Press to start cooking. two cooking stages can be set for each procedure. To program a procedure, follow the steps listed below.

## Page 23: Speed Cooking

• Press "Memory " to save the procedure. Oven beeps once. • To choose the procedure from the memory list, press "Memory" twice. Screen will display "2". • Press to start the procedure. • "Defrost " and "Auto Cook " cannot be set in memory function.

## Page 24: Silent Mode

9. Silent mode To activate the mute mode: In waiting state, press and hold "8" for 3 seconds. A long beep will sound. When you press the keys, it does not make a sound. To deactivate the mute mode: In silent mode, press and hold "8" for 3 seconds. A long beep will sound.

<u>Page 25</u> 12. INQUIRING FUNCTION When oven is cooking or in paused mode, press Clock, the current time will appear for three seconds in the display. 13. WIFI CONNECTION Connect the network Press and hold " " for 3 seconds, till a beep sounds, "AP" and flashing " "...

<u>Page 31</u> APPLIANCE FRONT WITH STAINLESS STEEL Hot soapy water: Clean using a dish cloth and then dry with a soft cloth. Remove splashes and patches of limescale, grease, starch and albumin immediately. Corrosion can form under these patches or splashes. Do not use glass cleaners or metal or glass scrapers for cleaning.
