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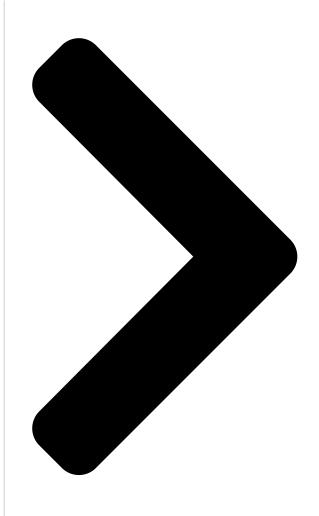

Page 28: Key Functions

Key Functions Earpiece lets you hear the caller and automated prompts. Signal Strength Indicator represents the signal strength by displaying bars. The more bars displayed, the better the signal strength. Main LCD (display) displays all the information needed to operate your phone, such as the call status, the Contacts list, the date and time, the signal and battery strength, etc.

<u>Page 29</u> Charger Jack connects the phone to the Standardized AC Travel Charger (included). Keypad lets you enter numbers, letters, and characters, and navigate within menus. Press and

hold keys 2-9 for speed dialing. SPEAKER Key lets you place or receive calls in speakerphone mode

<u>Page 30</u> Sub LCD lets you monitor the phone's status and see who's calling without opening the phone. LED Indicator shows your phone's connection status at a glance. Antenna delivers the best reception when fully extended. Headset Jack allows you to plug in an optional headset for convenient, hands-free conversations (for monaural headset only).

<u>Page 37</u> Installing the Battery To install the Li-lon battery: Insert the battery into the opening on the back of the phone and gently press down. Place the battery cover into the position as indicated in the diagram, and then slide it until you hear it snap into place. Removing the Battery WARNING Do not handle a damaged or leaking Li-lon battery as...

<u>Page 38</u> Charging the Battery Your phone's Li-Ion battery is rechargeable and should be charged as soon as possible so you can begin using your phone. Keeping track of your battery's charge is important. If your battery level becomes too low, your phone automatically turns off, and you will lose all the information you were just working on.

<u>Page 39</u> Using the Charger To use the travel charger provided with your phone: Plug the travel charger into a wall outlet. Plug the other end of the travel charger into the accessories connector at the bottom of your phone (with the battery installed). <u>Page 47</u> Answering a Roam Call With Call Guard Enabled Call Guard is an option that helps you manage your roaming charges when making or receiving calls while outside the Nationwide Sprint PCS Network. Please see Section 2D: Controlling Your Roaming Experience for more information about roaming.

Page 48: Using The Speakerphone

Ending a Call To disconnect a call when you are finished: Close the phone or press Note: If the setting for Close Flip is not set to "End Call," closing the phone will not end the call. (See "Setting the Open/Close Flip Option" on page 74.) Tip: Time/Date is displayed when you press...

Page 49 Changing the Ringer Volume To change the ringer volume, press the Side Volume key when the phone is open and in standby mode. Page 50: Missed Call Notification

Entering Text Selecting a Character Input Mode Your phone provides convenient ways to enter words, letters, punctuation, and numbers whenever you are prompted to enter text (for example, when adding a Contacts entry or when using Sprint PCS Picture Mail and SMS Text Messaging). Page 67: Sound Settings

Sound Settings Ringer Types Ringer types help you identify incoming calls and messages. You can assign ringer types to individual Contacts entries, types of calls, and types of messages. Preprogrammed Ringers include a variety of standard ringer types and familiar music. Vibrating Ringer alerts you to calls or messages without disturbing others.

<u>Page 68</u> Selecting Ringer Types for Messages To select a ringer type for messages: Select Press through the available ringers. A sample ringer will sound as you highlight each option. Press – or – Select My Content and scroll through the list of downloaded ringers.

Page 69: Selecting A Tone Length

Selecting Ringer Types for Voicemail or Calendar/Alarm To select a ringer type for voicemail or calendar/alarm: Select > Settings > Sounds > Ringer Type> Voicemail or Calendar/Alarm. Press , and then use your navigation key to scroll through the available ringers. A sample ringer will sound as you highlight each option.

Page 70: Using Voice Prompt

Using Voice Prompt This feature allows you to hear voice prompts at Voice Memo, Screen Call setting, etc. (default setting is off). To enable or disable voice prompt: Select Select On or Off. Tip: When ringer volume is set to "Silence All," voice prompts cannot be heard.

Page 71: Adjusting The Phone's Volume Settings

Adjusting the Phone's Volume Settings You can adjust your phone's volume settings to suit your needs and your environment. To adjust the ringer and key volume: Select > Settings > Sounds > Ringer/Key Vol. Select Ringer Volume, Calendar/Alarm, Start-up/Pw-off, or Key Beep.

Page 72: Alert Notification

Alert Notification Your phone can alert you with an audible tone when you change service areas, once a minute during a voice call, or when there are incoming or missed Sprint PCS Ready Link calls. To set alerts: Select Select your desired option and press Service sets an alert to notify you of network services parameter changes.

Page 73: Silence All

Silence All There may be times when you need to silence your phone entirely. The phone's Silence All option allows you to mute all sounds without turning your phone off. To activate Silence All: With the flip open, press the Side Volume key (down repeatedly until "Silence All"appears.

Page 74: Display Settings

Display Settings Changing the Text Greeting The text greeting can be up to 15 characters and is displayed on your phone's screen in standby mode. You may choose to keep the phone's default greeting ("Sprint"), or you may enter your own custom greeting. To display or change

your greeting: Select Enter a custom greeting using your keypad and press...

Page 75: Changing The Display Screen Animation

To change the Keypad backlight setting: Select Key after step 1 of "To change the Main LCD or Sub LCD backlight setting:"on the previous page. Select Always Off or a preset length of time. Note: Long backlight settings affect the battery's talk and standby times.

Page 76: Changing The Display For Area Name

Changing the Display for Area Name This feature enables you to show the state of the phone number you are calling or are called from when the number is not registered in your Contacts list. For example, a call to or from 213-555-5555 will display "California."...

Page 77: Standby Mode

Changing the Phone's Menu Style Your phone allows you to choose how the main menu items are displayed on your display screen. To select the display's menu style: Select > Settings > Display > Main Menu. Select Grid View or ListView. Grid View to view each main menu item as an animated single-screen icon.

Page 78: Changing The Background

Changing the Text Font Size This setting allows you to adjust the display appearance when entering text (for example, when writing a message or when adding a Contacts entry) or when viewing a message. To change the text input font: Select Select View or Input.

Page 79: Setting Return To Standby Mode

Setting Return to Standby Mode This feature allows you to select the way to return to standby mode. To set this feature: Select > Settings > Display > Return to Idle. A message appears. Press OK (left softkey) to continue. Select Automatically or End Key.

Page 80: Location Settings

Location Settings Your phone is equipped with a Location feature for use in connection with location-based services that may be available in the future. The Location feature allows the network to detect your position. Turning Location off will hide your location from everyone except 911.

Page 81: Messaging Settings

Messaging Settings Staying connected to your friends and family has never been easier. With your phone's advanced messaging capabilities, you can send and receive many different kinds of messages. (For more information, see "Using SMS Text Messaging"on page 171, "Accessing Messaging"on page 193, and "Using SMS Voice Messaging"on page 180.) Your phone's messaging settings make text messaging even faster and easier by letting you decide how you would like to...

<u>Page 82</u> Managing Preset Messages Your phone is loaded with 20 preset messages, in English and in Spanish, to help make sending text messages faster and easier. These messages, such as "Where are you?," "Let's get lunch," and "Meet me at," can be customized or deleted to suit your needs. To edit a preset message: Select (The list of preset messages is displayed.)

<u>Page 83</u> Setting a Callback Number With this feature, you can notify your recipients of your callback number with a text message. To set the callback number: Select > Settings > Messaging > Text > Send Callback#. Select an option from the following and press None to send no callback number.

<u>Page 84</u> Setting Drafts Alert Drafts Alert gives you a reminder when you have unsent messages waiting in the drafts folder. To set Drafts Alert: Select Select On. Setting the Speakerphone for SMS Voice Messaging You can set the speakerphone on or off for SMS Voice messaging.

Page 85: Airplane Mode

Setting an Alert Notification for SMS Voice Messaging SMS Voice Messaging uses your phone's data services. You can set your phone to play an alert to let you know you are connecting to

data services each time you access an SMS Voice message.

Page 86: Tty Use With Sprint Pcs Service

TTY Use With Sprint PCS Service ATTY(also known as a TDD or TextTelephone) is a telecommunications device that allows people who are deaf, hard-of-hearing, or who have speech or language disabilities to communicate by telephone. Your phone is compatible with select TTY devices. Please check with the manufacturer of your TTY device to ensure that it supports digital wireless transmission.

<u>Page 87</u> To turn TTY Mode on or off: > Settings > Others > TTY. Select (An informational message is displayed.) Press or OK (left softkey) to continue. Select Enable to turn TTY mode On. - or - Select Disable to turn TTY mode Off. Note: In TTY Mode, your phone will display the TTY access icon.

Page 88: Phone Setup Options

Phone Setup Options Shortcut (My Favorites) Your phone offers you the option of assigning a shortcut key to a favorite or often-used function. Pressing the navigation key to the left in standby mode will launch your personally designated shortcut. To assign your shortcut key: Press the navigation key left.

Page 89: Display Language

Auto-Answer Mode You may set your phone to automatically pick up incoming calls when connected to an optional hands-free car kit or a headset. To set Auto-Answer mode: Select > Settings > Others > Auto Answer. Select an option and press Car Kit/Headset to answer calls automatically when the phone is connected to a hands-free car kit or a headset (sold separately).

Page 90: Setting The Current Time

Setting the Current Time To set the current time when you are roaming in an area with no digital network: Select Set the current time and date and press Note: This feature is available only when you are in an area with no digital network available.

Page 91: Setting Any Key Answer

Setting Any Key Answer This feature allows you to answer incoming calls by pressing any key (except To turn any key answer on or off: > Settings > Others > Any Key Answer. Select Select On or Off . Setting the Side Key Guard This feature enables you to lock the side keys while the flip is closed.

Page 92: Setting Abbreviated Dialing

Recent Access to display the three most recently used input mode menu items from the top of the list when this setting is set to on. T9 Settings to customize the T9 settings (see page 46). Add Word to store words that you use frequently (see page 45).

Page 93: Setting Headset Mode

Setting Headset Mode This feature allows you hands-free phone use. Set the headset mode to Voice Call or Ready Link and press the Turbo Button (the operation button) on the headset to activate useful functions such as making calls, receiving calls, or switching to the Voice Command feature.

Page 94: Wireless Backup
