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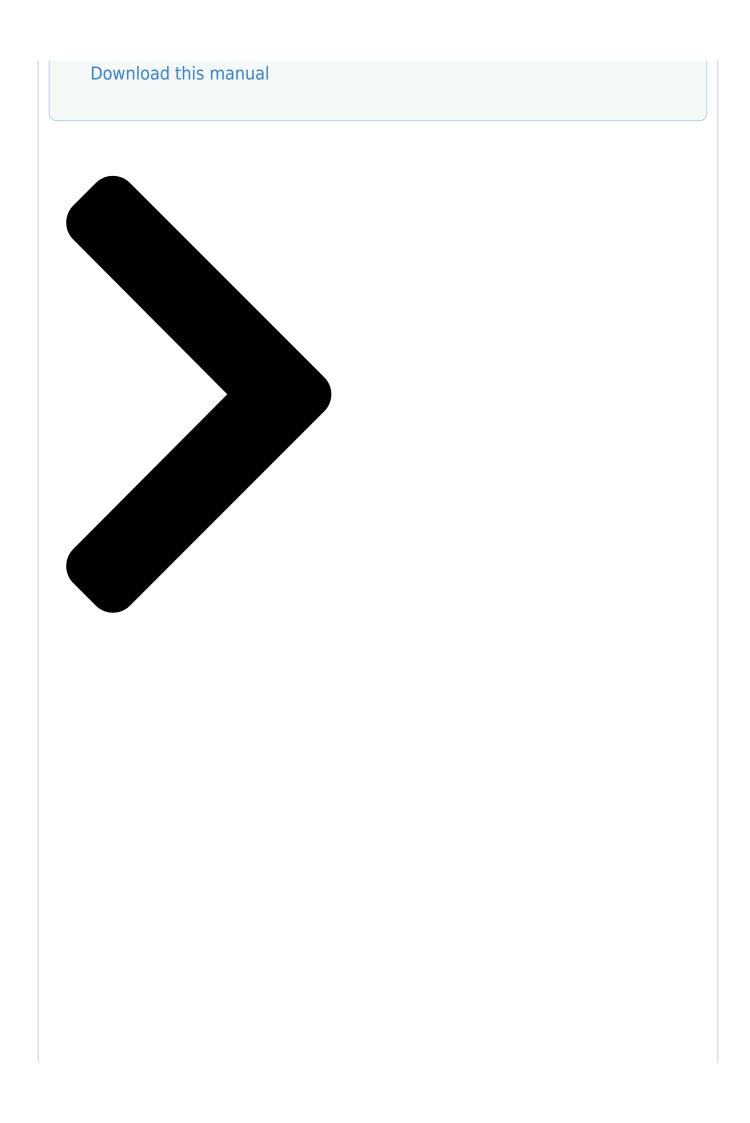

1. POWER LEVELS Ten power levels are available. Press "Cook Time", "00:00" will display, then press number pads. Press "Power Level" and "PL10" will display. Then press number pads to select a different power level. In cooking state of microwave, press "Power Level", the current power will be displayed for 3 seconds.

Page 38: Clock Setting

LEVEL POWER DISPLAY 2. CLOCK SETTING When the microwave oven is plugged into an outlet, "0:00" will display. Press "Clock" once, "00:00" will appear in the display. Press the number pads to enter the current clock time. For example, if the time is now 10:12, press " 1, 0, 1, 2 " in order. Press "Clock"...

Page 39: Microwave Cook

Press " START/+30Sec. " to confirm setting, and the timer will start to count down. When the time amount elapses, timer indicator will disappear. The oven will beep 5 times. • The Kitchen Timer setting is different from the Clock setting; it is simply a timer.

Page 40: One Touch Start

• Press "1, 5, 0, 0" in order for 15:00 to appear in the display. • Press "Power Level" , then press "5" to select 50% microwave power. • Press " START/+30Sec. " to start cooking. The remaining cooking time will display. •...

Page 41: Custom Defrost Function

6. CUSTOM DEFROST FUNCTION Press "Custom Defrost", "dEF1" and "DEF." will appear in the display. Press the same pad repeatedly, "dEF2", "dEF3", "dEF1" will display in order.
