SETTING UP YOUR OVEN TURNTABLE INSTALLATION Cleaning the cooking compartment and putting the turntable in place. For new installations, make sure all packaging and shipping tape has been removed from the turntable shaft. Before using the appliance to prepare food for the first time, you will need to put the turntable in place correctly.

<u>Page 20</u> COUNTERTOP INSTALLATION Remove all packing material and accessories. Examine the oven for any damage such as dents or broken door. Do not install if oven is damaged. Cabinet: Remove any protective film found on the microwave oven cabinet surface. Do not remove the light brown Mica cover that is attached to the oven cavity to protect the magnetron.

Page 25: Microwave Cook

When the kitchen time arrives, clock indicator will go out. The buzzer will ring one time. At the end of cooking, the bee rings and returns to standby status. • Kitchen Timer is a timer. That is to say it poccesses the function of alarming clock. NOTE 3.

<u>Page 26</u> LEVEL POWER DISPLAY Example: to cook the food with 50% microwave power for 15 minutes. • Press " Cook Time/Clock " twice. "00:00" displays. • Press "1", "5", "0", "0" in order. • Press "POWER LEVEL "once, then press "5" to select 50% microwave power.

Page 27: Speedy Cooking

"Alexa, add X to the microwave." • When your microwave is in use, you can ask it to cook for additional time by saying, "Alexa, add X to the microwave," where X is the amount of time you'd like to add. For example, to add 2 minutes to the cooking time while the microwave is already running, say "Alexa, add 2 minutes to the microwave.

Page 28: Weight Defrost Function

At the end of cooking, the bee rings and returns to standby status. • Under microwave and time defrost states, press " START/30SEC. " button to increase cooking time by 30 seconds. • Under sensor menu cooking and weight defrost state, time cannot be added NOTE by pressing "...

Page 29: Time Defrost Function

6. TIME DEFROST FUNCTION Press "TIME DEFROST", LED will display "dEF2". Press numerical buttons to input defrost time to be defrosted. Input the time ranged is between 0:01~99:99. Press "START/30SEC." to start defrosting. The default microwave power is PL3. The power cannot be adjusted. At the end of cooking, the bee rings and returns to standby status.

Page 30: Potato

TIMES(PRESS "POPCORN") WEIGHT DISPLAY Once 2.75 Oz 2.75 Twice 3.2 Oz Popcorn "Alexa, microwave 1.5 ounces of popcorn." • To microwave popcorn, say "Alexa, microwave X ounces of popcorn". Your microwave oven will determine the time to cook your popcorn appropriately. For example, to microwave oven 2.2 ounces of popcorn, say "Alexa, microwave 2.2 ounces of popcorn.

Page 32: Inquiring Function

• Press "POWER LEVEL " once. • Then press number button "6" to set 60% microwave power. • Press " START/30SEC. " start cooking. • Auto menu and reheat menu cannot be set as one of the multi-section. • When microwave cooking is the second part of multiple cooking, you must NOTE press the cooking clock.

Page 33: Eco Function

13. ECO FUNCTION Dump screen: In standby state, press Stop/Cancel key, buzzer, screen extinguished, enter ECO mode. Awakening: In ECO mode, opening the furnace door or pressing any key can awaken the display and enter the standby state; In ECO mode, the first button pressing is to wake up the display.
