Page 37: Cleaning And Maintenance

<u>Page 38</u> APPLIANCE FRONT WITH STAINLESS STEEL Hot soapy water: Clean using a dish cloth and then dry with a soft cloth. Remove splashes and patches of limescale, grease, starch and

albumin immediately. Corrosion can form under these patches or splashes. Do not use glass cleaners or metal or glass scrapers for cleaning.
