Page 7: Using Yourdryer

USING Starting YourDryer Before using your dryer, wipe the dryer drum with a damp YOURDRYER cloth to remove dust from storing and shipping. 1. Load clothes loosely into the dryer and close the door. Do not pack the dryer. Allow space for clothes to tumble freely.

Damp dry items such as jeans (to prevent stiffness) or cotton clothes (to make pressing easier).

Page 11: Caring Foryour Dryer
