Express Gate allows you to upload files from the hard disk drive and USB drives and to download files to USB drives only. Shows network status; click to configure network settings. Shows volume status; click to change volume. Configures input method settings as well as keyboard shortcuts. Eee Box PC...

[Page 29](#) Customizes LaunchBar settings. Shows the “ASUS Utility” panel. Shows Express Gate version information. Opens Express Gate online Help. Opens the “Power Off” menu. You can also press CTRL + ALT + DEL on the keyboard to open this menu. Power Off...
