#### Page 32: Quick Settings

Status icons The icons in the right of the system bar indicate the status of your tablet, such as current time. Notification icons The icons in the left of the system bar indicate different types of notifications. In addition to system notification icons, applications you installed on your tablet may use their own notification icons.

# Page 36: Changing The Screen Orientation

The screen orientation automatically changes according to the rotation angle detected. You can lock the auto rotation and use the tablet always in Portrait or Landscape mode.

#### Page 37: Factory Reset

#### Page 40: Calculator

Tap a page in the list to open it. View your Browser history As you browse the web, Browser will keep track of the pages you visit, to help you find your way back later. Tap the bookmark icon ( ) at the upper right corner of the screen.

# Page 41: Calendar

Open Calculator by tapping All Apps -> Calculator. Enter numbers and arithmetical operators on the basic screen. Press & hold the Calculator's display to select Copy or Cut the numbers. Tap Clear icon ( ) to delete the last number or operator you entered.

#### Page 46: Gallery

# Page 47: Playing Music

#### Page 48: Search For A Contact

#### Page 51: Toshiba File Manager

#### Page 53: Basic Operations

#### Page 56: Settings

A scrollbar is displayed on the right side of the screen. This scrollbar is only used to show the position of the displaying area.

#### Page 57: Wi-Fi Networks

Tethering & portable hotspot settings You can share your tablet's mobile data connection with

other devices (up to 8) via USB, Bluetooth, or by turning your tablet into a portable Wi-Fi hotspot. Tap to adjust these settings. This function is only supported by 3G models. Some models support NFC (Near Field Communication) which allows you to share data between devices when they touch each other or are brought into close proximity.

<u>Page 58</u> Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the ON position. The tablet scans for available Wi-Fi networks and displays the names of those it finds. Secured networks are indicated with a lock icon. If the tablet finds a network that you connected to previously, it will connect to it automatically.

#### Page 59: Advanced Wi-Fi Settings

Proxy server settings may be required for some internal or external network connection. By default, the Wi-Fi networks you add are not configured to connect via a proxy server, but you can change that for each Wi-Fi network you've added. Proxy settings are used by Browser and may not be used by other apps.

#### Page 64: Device
